Psalm 22:1-11 A Psalm of Lament

¹My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?

² O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.

³ Yet you are holy,

enthroned on the praises of Israel.

⁴ In you our ancestors trusted;

they trusted, and you delivered them.

⁵ To you they cried, and were saved;

in you they trusted, and were not put to shame.

⁶ But I am a worm, and not human;

scorned by others, and despised by the people.

⁷ All who see me mock at me;

they make mouths at me, they shake their heads;

Psalms of Lament:

Lament: to express deep sorrow or deep regret, to mourn, to wail or complain.

Most popular category of Psalms. Laments are both individual and communal. In a lament, grievances against God or enemies are expressed. Individuals seek deliverance from illness or false accusation and nations seek deliverance in times of distress. The psalmists also went through the same emotions we have! They use words that are often much better than our own to express how we feel. Laments are accompanied by affirmations of faith in a God who creates, judges, loves, forgives, heals, helps, and redeems. Laments are usually accompanied by a request for God to do something!
