We will find new ways to partner and bring God's love to others in our community and beyond. How exciting to think about what God has in store for us in 2025!

As we head into 2025 and, as we live together in God's love, we know that God goes with us. As Pastor Lisa would so often share during the blessing at the end of worship: As you go on your way, may Christ go with you. May Christ go before you to show you the way. #### Stewardship Corner

Intentional and Regular 2025 Giving through Automatic Withdrawal

As we begin a new year, we start to make goals and maybe even "new year resolutions" for 2025. These goals and resolutions can be helpful to making the year a success and changing our habits for the better. The beginning of the year is also a great time to plan ahead for your charitable giving for the year.

Pastor Charles Lane in his book, *Ask, Thank, Tell*, writes that one of the characteristics of a biblical giver is that they give intentionally. An intentional giver has a strategy for their sharing. They make generosity a part of their overall financial plan and then they live out that plan of sharing throughout the year. A biblical giver does not share only when they feel like sharing, and they don't only share out of whatever is left over at the end of the month. They stick to their plan sharing intentionally and regularly.

As we enter into the new year, I encourage you to have a plan for your sharing and to execute that plan this year. One easy way to ensure that our giving is regular and intentional is to set up an automatic giving plan where your sharing with Abiding Savior is automatically given through electronic funds transfer every month. This intentional giving will help keep you on track in your sharing for the year and will ensure that Abiding Savior receives your gift whether you are in worship, at the cabin, or on the beaches of Florida. #### Thursday Bible Study – Honoring Our Neighbor's Faith



Have you ever wondered what other Christians believe? Why are there so many different flavors of Lutheran? How does the Pentecostal Church compare with the Lutheran Church, or the Baptist Church, or the Catholic Church? What do Seventh Day Adventist, Mormons or Christian Scientists believe? How do you have a good discussion with a Jehovah's Witness at your door? As fellow Christians we have much in common, but we often fail to understand one another. We are curious about others who worship the God of Abraham through the Jewish and Muslim traditions. Where do we differ and where can

we find common ground? Do our prayers all go to the same place? And what about those who faithfully practice world religions unrelated to Christianity, like Buddhists or Hindus? Worshiping idols or believing in reincarnation are very different from our experience. Is one wrong and the other right, or might there be differing ways to be faithful? We will consider these and many more questions as part of the Thursday morning Women's Bible Study led by Pastor Marla.

Each week we'll reflect on different faith traditions, noting similarities and differences with the Lutheran faith.

We'll ask questions about how these differences came to be and what they mean for us today. We'll explore the challenges of living in a pluralistic country - where people of many faiths and no faith live side-by-side, and we'll consider how we honor one another's beliefs while being faithful to our own understanding of God. We will occasionally welcome guest speakers from other faith traditions and will also take some field trips to visit other places of worship and learn first-hand about an interesting mix of beliefs and practices. Join us **Thursdays at 10AM** as we explore a wide range of faith traditions in a setting of fellowship and mutual support. Enjoy the delicious treats, prayer, music and supportive community that the Women's Bible Study provides. We hope to see you there.


