"Neighborhood" Church

After worship one Sunday morning I was approached by someone who lives in the neighborhood surrounding Abiding Savior, but was not a member of the church. This was someone I had spoken with before



and who was familiar with ministries both inside and outside the walls of our congregation. After our conversation this person handed me an envelope a thanked me for worship that day.

Later when I opened the envelope, I found a check for \$2000 and on the memo line was written the words, "neighborhood church". Not only was I amazed at the act of generosity from this person, I was also struck by their understanding of Abiding Savior as the "neighborhood" church. To me, this meant that those living in the community see that we are not an inwardly looking church, but a church that is reaching out into this community. We are not only a place to gather for worship and fellowship, but also a center for mission and ministry from which we are sent to spread God's love in Mounds View and beyond.

The person who gave this generous donation, and many others in the area, noticed Abiding Savior and the work that we are doing in this community. They certainly notice our family fun night in August when the backyard is filled with neighbors enjoying time together. They notice our Fall Festival and Trunk or Treat in October. This March there were about 120 kids from the area at our Easter Egg Hunt. We are known as a place for families to gather and a place that loves and appreciates children.

Not only do those in the community notice the events that bring us together, they also notice the love and care we send out from this place. They see our support of the Irondale Pantry, Community Partners with Youth, the Community Support Center, Ralph Reeder Food Shelf and Quincy House. They see our Wednesday Night Dinners bringing nutrition to seniors and others in the community. They know we are a "neighborhood" church doing amazing things in God's name both inside and outside our walls.

Our neighbors see us reaching out in love and our neighbors see us bringing people together. As we live together in God's love, may we continue to be a place where faith is nurtured, and we live out that faith in love and service to this community and beyond.

Mission Endowment Fund Awards Grants

The Abiding Savior Mission Endowment Fund is pleased to announce the 2024 grant recipients. The Endowment was able to gift \$8,620 in 2024! Thank you to those who have generously donated to the Endowment. If you have any questions about how to include the Abiding Savior Mission Endowment Fund in your estate planning or will or have any questions about the Endowment Fund, please talk to Pastor Ryan Brodin.

The 2024 Abiding Savior Mission Endowment Fund grant recipients are:

- Abiding Savior Preschool: Our church's preschool serves children ages 16 months to 5 years in our Toddler and Preschool Programs. Their grant will go toward a fund being established to help replace the wooden fence structure surrounding the preschool playground.
- **Community Partners with Youth: Summer (CPY):** CPY works with at risk children and youth in our school district and uses our building for their elementary school program during the summer. Their grant will be used to go toward the purchase of a mini-bus.
- **Community Support Center (CSC):** The CSC supports individuals and families that are near homelessness in our community. Abiding Savior is a founding congregation of the CSC. Their grant will help to sponsor their annual luncheon.
- **Garden of Grace:** The Garden of Grace is the collection of Abiding Savior's garden beds that individuals and families maintain over the summer, using the gifts of land, sunshine, and other resources God has given us to grow healthy food! The grant will be used for some much needed renovations.
- **Humble Walk Lutheran Church:** Humble Walk is a big hearted community in the heart of the West 7th Neighborhood in St. Paul. They reach people on the margins through art projects, music and community meals. Their grant will be used toward summer programming as an opportunity to elevate community care and build connection.
- **Quincy House:** Quincy House works with at risk teens in our community through their house on Red Oak Drive. Their grant will help to provide meals for the teens.
- **Shobi's Table Food Truck:** Shobi's Table is a feeding ministry of the St. Paul Area Synod. Their grant will help them purchase a fridge for their 'Love Made Edible' food truck.
