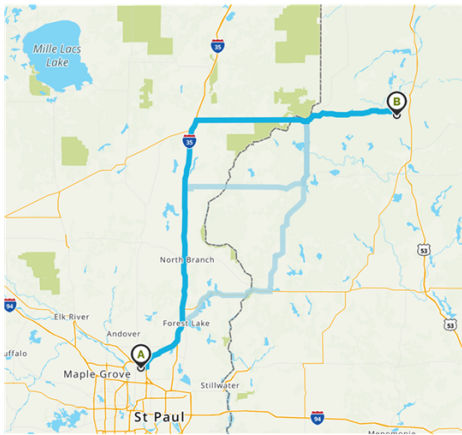


# Why come?

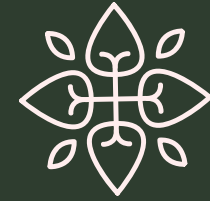
# What to bring
