**Saul, David and Solomon**

1. Before Saul was named king, who directly ruled God’s people? Who rules God’s people today? How does God rule today?
  
2. Why did God choose David to be the king? Do we sometimes judge people according to how they look as opposed to their heart?
  
3. What can we learn about challenges in our own lives from the story of David and Goliath?
  
4. Read 2 Samuel 11:1-5, 14-15, 12:13-14. Should what David did be considered wrong, even though he was a great king? What did God do? Does God forgive us when we make mistakes? Even though we are forgiven, do we still have to pay consequences for our sins?
  
5. David was God’s anointed one, yet he sinned. Did God still use him for good? Are we chosen by God? Do we sin? Does God still use us? How does God use you?
  
6. If you could be granted any wish, what would you wish for? What did Solomon wish for? Was that a waste of his wish?
  
7. Although Solomon was wealthy and powerful, he turned away from God. Read I Kings 11:1-3, 9-13. Do we sometimes forget about God when we have lots of money and power? How should people with money and power behave?
  
8. List the three kings from today’s lesson and two things that each king did during his reign.
