January 17 - Why and How Camp Forms Faith

If you have a child or grandchild, you do not want to miss this opportunity to hear the Executive Director of Camp Wapo, Paul Hill. Paul has been with WAPO for almost a year and has a long history of serving and teaching about children's and youth ministries in the church. Paul has led and utilized church camps across the country throughout his professional career, and he has taught outdoor ministry courses at Luther Seminary. He is a certified camp director and high adventure facilitator. Camp runs deep in Paul's DNA as he has personally experienced the powerful transformation that happens at camp. Dr. Hill will be preaching in worship this Sunday as well as teaching during the Education hour. Don't miss this opportunity to learn more about developing faith in your children, youth or grandchildren.

January 24 - The Christian and Politics

Lutherans have often been hesitant about engaging in political activity. Byron Schmid, Abiding Savior member and retired ELCA pastor with a Ph.D in Political Science, will identify the reasons for this stance and describe the increasing role of American Lutherans in government in the past 50 years. He also will express the urgency for Christian involvement in politics as a function of responsible Christian discipleship.

January 31- American Politics and Value Choices

In this second of two sessions, Byron Schmid will discuss the basic values involved in American political philosophy. He will also compare and contrast the primary value commitments in the current American political parties. (Minnesota precinct caucuses will be held on Tuesday, March 1.)

<u>February 7</u> - Pastor Mike Matson from Augsburg College

We welcome Pastor Mike Matson to be our guest preacher and presenter at Adult Forum that day. Abiding Savior and Augsburg College have a long history together. Abiding Savior was formed as a member of the denomination known as the Lutheran Free Church. Augsburg College was the college of the Lutheran Free Church. In the past Abiding Savior has made periodic gifts to Augsburg College including a donation toward their current Chapel. Augsburg is building a new learning space that

incorporates science, business, and religion. The Church Council of Abiding Savior has agreed to make a donation, along with many other area churches with Lutheran Free roots, to the construction of the new building. This donation will be given from the 75^{th} Anniversary benevolence fund. The Council thought it fitting to make a gift that honors our past relationship with Augsburg as we celebrated God's faithfulness to Abiding Savior yesterday, today and tomorrow. Pastor Matson will share with us more about the new facility as well as the work that Augsburg College is carrying out today.

Creating a Community of Love through Fundraising

When we think about building up the Kingdom of God, we do not often think about fundraising. We think instead about evangelism, Bible study, caring, and reaching out in love toward others. But the reality is these other areas of building up the kingdom of God all take some kind of funding.

Henry Nouwen was an internationally renowned priest and author who wrote over 40 books on spiritual life. He encouraged those who raise funds for the church and other religious organizations by saying, "If you raise funds for the creation of a community of love, you are building the kingdom. You are doing exactly what you are supposed to do as Christians."

Abiding Savior is most certainly a Community of Love. We care deeply for one another, we share faith with our youth and children, we gather to worship our God, and we reach out in love and service to those outside our walls both locally and internationally. All of these actions of love build up the Kingdom of God.

Henry Nouwen goes on to say, "Asking people for money is giving them the opportunity of putting their resources at the disposal of the Kingdom of God, it is giving other people the chance of offering their resources for the work of God." Henri Nouwen is calling us to think about the sharing our resources not as a burden or obligation, but as a privilege. This is a wonderful ministry! It is a blessing to serve God's children!



JUST OPENED BRAND NEW RINK! Drastically different than a traditional ice rink, Central Park's skating trail is a meandering, 800' loop that winds its way through the park landscape (for comparison, a lap around a traditional hockey rink is 570'). This design offers a more sensory experience and a very welcome change in scenery while skating; the feeling is less like skating laps and more like a stroll through the park. However, like a rink, the skating loop is refrigerated and maintained by a Zamboni.

Bring a few dollars and we will stop over to the coffee shop across the street and get something warm to drink after skating. We will be outside most of the whole time so dress accordingly. 
