Being Fed in and through Abiding Savior (literally)

Certainly we have experienced the many ways that we are fed spiritually through Abiding Savior. There are meaningful worship services, Bible studies, Sunday school, Confirmation, youth group, adult education opportunities, circles, caring ministries, and so much more happening that feed our souls in and through this congregation.



But are you aware of the many ways we are feeding people literally as well? We often joke with one another about how we gather so often around food for meetings or classes or fellowship here at Abiding Savior. But we are also taking that passion for food outside the walls of our congregation as well. There are people in our community who are hungry, and we are working to live out our calling to love our neighbor through feeding ministries.

Here are just some of the ways we are feeding people (literally) in this congregation:

- Wednesday Night Dinners we feed many seniors and others that otherwise might not have a hot and nutritious meal including meals delivered to shut-ins
- **Pinewood SnackPack Program** We send home 53 backpacks a weekend for kids who otherwise might not have enough to eat

Shobi's Table - We partner with this food truck ministry feeding people on St. Paul's East Side


CPY - Through our kitchen in the summer months, over one hundred elementary aged kids from our community receive a hot and nutritious meal.

Quincy Treehouse - Providing a weekly evening meal to at risk youth in our community

- Wednesday Bread Through a partnership with Cub Foods, we provide seniors and others with bread products every Wednesday free of charge.
- Garden of Grace This Community Garden on our property provides over three hundred pounds of fresh produce to the local Ralph Reeder Food Shelf
- Other feeding ministries: Meals on Wheels, Feed My Starving Children, Sharing and Caring Hands, Sunday brunches, love fund, food shelf donations...

These are just some of the ways that we are feeding people (literally) in and through our congregation. All of these ministries happen only because of your generosity and the generosity of others. What a blessing it is to be able to share abundantly and to live out our calling from God to love our neighbors!

All are welcome to eat even if you don't bring anything to share. A free will basket will be put out to help cover the price of the pork, etc.





We live in suburban America and are privileged to be among the most wealthy people not only in the United States, but also the entire world. It can be tempting for us to believe that we have earned everything that we call our own. This puts us in danger of not feeling gratitude toward God.

Herbert Mather in his book **That's** What My Mother Taught Me: And Other Ways Generous Givers Develop, writes:

"From the Christian perspective, until we recognize and affirm the gift of God's love and forgiveness in Jesus Christ, we cannot respond in gratitude. There is no basis for gratitude when we are convinced that we earned everything we have that is worthwhile. Where there is generosity, there is conviction. Where there is generosity, there is enthusiasm. Conviction and enthusiasm emerge from what God has done and is doing in the life of the giver."

Gratitude causes us to react in passionate ways to the blessings we have received and one of the main ways we express this gratitude is through acts of generosity. When we truly know and believe that everything we call our own really and truly belongs to God, then we cannot help but to be grateful and to respond in acts of generosity in our lives as well.




Task Force Update
