DISCOVERING.... AND TELLING YOUR FAMILY STORY



The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has a new hymnal called the Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) hymnal. The ELW was created to both incorporate the green Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW) and blue With One-Voice (WOV), and to offer new liturgies,



hymns and worship helps. More comprehensive than previous worship books, the ELW is still compact and easy to handle. It introduces a rich and broad selection of new songs and prayers—yet it includes much that churches know, cherish, and use from existing resources. The pastors, music staff, Worship Committee, and Reimagining Worship Task Force are all recommending we move to the new hymnal to enhance our worship experience. You can donate a hymnal in memory or in honor of a loved one. The hymnals cost \$25 each and this includes shipping and a label on the inside acknowledging both the donor and the person being honored or remembered. We hope to start using the new hymnals for worship in December!

The First Smorgasbord in 1940

The first Smorgasbord at this church was held in 1940 and was designed as a fund raiser. The church building was nearing completion and funds were short, but the Ladies Guild (as they were known then) were confident they could host a successful fundraiser smorgasbord.

Florence Gustafson and Peggy Gilbertson were the chairs and they worked hard to get local merchants to donate food to the event, but there were still equipment items they needed to buy. Shopping in the neighborhood was limited due to the lack of stores, so George Gustafson, Florence's husband, drove the ladies to the downtown Minneapolis Woolworths store on November 11, 1940. The day was bright and beautiful, such a nice fall day that Florence had not even bothered to take a coat. While she and the ladies shopped for the large scale cooking equipment they needed, George waited in the car. The beautiful day quickly clouded over and the wind turned cold as rain and then snowflakes began to swirl around George's car. The snow grew thicker and George was about ready to go into the store to find his wife and her shopping companions when they finally came out to see the dramatic change in the The drive back to the Spring Lake Park neighborhood was slow, cold and treacherous with ice covered roads and viciously blowing snow, but George was able to get them all home safely and they forever after had a great story to tell about how they got caught in what became known as the Armistice Day Blizzard.

And the dinner? The weather was far better that day and ladies sold some 300 tickets—adult tickets were 35 cents and children's were 15 cents. After more than 30 pounds of meatballs, 14 pans of scalloped potatoes, eight pounds of pickled herring, and all the trimmings, the dinner made a profit of \$90.46.

The event was a wonderful success in terms of fellowship, community outreach and economics, and it as destined to become a tradition at SLP Lutheran. The date as eventually settled as being on Election Day each year and continues as a community outreach and fellowship event **76 years later**.

Warm Neighbors Thank you!



This year's coat drive numbers are in: We contributed 58 coats to the total of 625 collected. 425 were distributed to neighbors at the Oct. 15th give-away, along with collected snow pants, hats, gloves, scarves, and boots. The remaining 200 coats were given to St. Vincent de Paul, Hmong Center, and CEAP to warm others in need. Many thanks to all who contributed and volunteered for this collaborative effort!

<u>Community Support Center - CSC</u> <u>Supporting those on the margins!</u>

Abiding Savior is one of the Founding Churches for the Community Support Center, which delivers services to our neighbors in Mounds View, New Brighton, Shoreview, and Arden Hills. It was organized to help prevent homelessness in our local communities.

On Monday, October 17th, the CSC began operating as an independent non-profit 501 (c) (3) organization. Until that date the Community Support Center coordinated with the Community Emergency Assistance Program, CEAP, to the area that roughly corresponds to the Mounds View School District.

The main function is to provide services to our neighbors, families and individuals who are at risk of eviction because of the inability to pay rent or bills for other essentials such as utilities. CSC services try to secure financial aid from other agencies when people are in a time of crisis. Once the crisis is resolved, staff and volunteers continue in relationship with them to promote increased financial and social stability to avoid similar crisis in the future.

(CSC - continued)

A survey of neighbors who have had longterm relationships with the CSC revealed the following:

- 95% said they were referred to other sources for aid.
- 74% said they received direct aid from the CSC.
- 100% said they felt supported and encouraged to work towards goals they wanted to achieve.

From a neighbor: "Support I got from them gave me the push and support I needed to do better. Encouraged me to keep working and not feel that I had to do them alone. Glad to meet them, Gave me hope when I had no hope. Grateful I had their support."

DO NOT INCLUDE: war related items, chocolate, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items.
