Faith Symbols/Colors



Anchor - ranks among the most ancient of Christian symbols found relating to the virtue of hope of salvation and holding secure in faith.



Fish - used by early persecuted Christians to secretly symbolize their faith. The letters 'IXOYC' are Greek initials of "Jesus Christ, God's Son, Savior" & spell the Greek word for fish.



Cup/Chalice - a sacred vessel and symbol in which is contained the consecrated wine or the Blood of Christ.



Shell - representing the sacrament of Baptism, especially of Jesus' Baptism by John the Baptist.



Cross - the symbol of the crucifixion and the great price Jesus paid for the salvation of all humankind. Symbol of hope, love and sacrifice.



Dove - symbolizes purity, innocence, peace and is used to represent the Holy Spirit. The dove brought back an olive branch to Noah which was a sign to him that the waters had receded.



Triangle/Trinity - the symbol of the three divine persons of the One True God. In the unity of the Godhead there are Three Persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.



Fire - seen throughout the Old and New Testaments as representing the presence of God. From the burning bush of Moses to the Red Sea and also at Pentecost.



Wheat - symbol of prosperity and fruitfulness, as well as the bread it will become and the hunger it will satisfy.

Yellow/Gold light, purity, youth, happiness, the harvest, hospitality, love, benevolence, endurance & strength,

Orange fire and flame.

Red action, fire, charity, spiritual awakening, the Holy Spirit.

Purple fasting, faith, patience and trust - used during Advent and Lent.

Blue hope and good health - alternate color for the season of Advent.

Green bountifulness, hope and the victory of life over death.

Brown earth, humility and God's connection with the common & ordinary.

White purity, innocence, and birth - the color of Christmas and Easter.

Black death, fear and ignorance - the color of Good Friday.
